On July 3, 2024, Linda Mary Keene Lewis (Rabiei), 83, of Alexandria, Virginia, returned to her Father in heaven. Linda was born in Oswego, New York on September 5, 1940. Linda was selfless and generous, sharing a smile with everyone through good and challenging times. At the age of 18, she moved to Washington, D.C. to attend George Washington University. When her late husband "Tony" was unexpectedly injured, she spent time by his side daily for many years and coordinated with his medical team. She did this while working to maintain her career. Linda never missed an opportunity to attend a concert or event of a child or grandchild while she was physically able to do so. She knew the importance of being there for family

and friends, or just being there to listen and love without judgement. In her later years, Linda learned to be on the receiving end of the help she often extended to others. She was so very grateful for those who supported her. She was brave and courageous. She held a deep faith in God throughout her life, which sustained her through struggles. She was raised Catholic and later became a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Linda was very loved and will be deeply missed.
