Louise Jamison, age 89, of Haymarket, Virginia passed away January 24, 2014 at Fairfax Hospital, Fairfax, Virginia.

Louise was born February 16, 1924 to Louis and Estelle Lightner at home on Bonnie Brae Farm in Haymarket, Virginia. She completed her business degree at Strayer Business College. Louise worked two years for the FBI and then was offered a teaching position in Loudoun County. Louise taught first grade for 36 years in the Loudoun and Prince William public school systems. Upon her retirement from the public school system, Louise opened and operated a pre-school in Haymarket named the "4 Rs". Louise is a member of Antioch Baptist Church.

She is pre-deceased by her son, Russell (Rusty) Lewis Jamison and her siblings; Louis Field Lightner, George Lightner, Charlotte Hall and Margaret Seay.

Survivors include her sisters, Ann Park and Helen Ray, numerous nephews and nieces and extended family members.

Funeral service will be held on Tuesday, January 28th 12:30 pm. at the Pierce Funeral Home, 9609 Center Street, Manassas, Va. Visitation with the family will be held one hour prior to the service. Interment at Stonewall Memory Gardens will follow after the service.

Louise requested that a Teacher's Scholarship Fund be established to assist future teachers' educational pursuits in the Haymarket community.
