Luisa C. Esteban, 88, of Orlando, FL, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, June 26, 2024.

She was the epitome of selflessness and generosity, always putting others' needs before her own and serving as a role model through her unwavering kindness and compassionate spirit. Luisa had a remarkable career, starting as an accountant with US Air and later becoming a travel agent at Multi Travel, a role she enjoyed until the age of 86. Luisa was a devoted member of Blessed Trinity Church in Orlando, FL, where she faithfully attended services and served communion. Born in the Philippines, Luisa moved to Alexandria in 1968, and then to Orlando in 1989, where she lived until her return to Virginia in 2019.
