Madge Delphine Hayworth Carrico of the Nokesville area passed on April 29, 2013 at Loudon Hospital.

Madge Hayworth was born in 1926 near Wallburg, NC, the youngest of 8 children and grew up on a small tobacco farm during the Great Depression. After High School she studied to become a nurse and took a job that brought her to Virginia, where she met and married the love of her life, Clarence Carrico. A few years later, widowed at a young age with a small child, Mrs. Carrico took a position with the Prince William County Public Health Department where she spent her entire career. Remarkably during this time, despite being a single parent, Mrs. Carrico managed to complete her Bachelors degree in Nursing from the University of Virginia, becoming the first member of her family to graduate from college. She later went on to earn a Masters in Immunology from Johns Hopkins. Mrs. Carrico eventually retired as a Region Supervisor for the Health Department where she was beloved and respected by her colleagues and looked upon as a role model for those who came up after her.

In retirement Mrs. Carrico was an active member of Greenwich Presbyterian Church, and became known to relatives and non-relatives alike simply as "Aunt Madge" around the "Scuffleburg" community where she enjoyed gardening, cooking and nutrition, as well as always keeping up with politics

and current events.

Madge Carrico will always be remembered not only for her fierce independence and determination, but for her humor, kindness and charity, and for being a good friend and proud, loving mother. She will be missed by all those whose lives she touched in such positive ways.

Mrs. Carrico is survived by her son Gary, and her sister Mary Helen Hayworth Craver of High Point, NC.
