July 24, 1946 - February 23, 2019

Margaret (Peggy) Ann Endicott, age 72, of Gainesville, VA, died Saturday, February 23, 2019, at Haymarket Medical Center in Haymarket, VA. She was born on Wednesday, July 24, 1946, in Washington, DC, was raised in Alexandria and lived there as well as Manassas and Annandale, VA prior to moving to Gainesville. In Gainesville, Peggy was a member of St. Katharine Drexel Mission. She is survived by her life-time companion, Joy M. Plante, her brother David and his wife Elizabeth Endicott of Weatherby Lake, MO. She was preceded in death by her Father-Benjamin Earl Endicott, Sr., Mother-Helen Terrell Endicott, and her brother Benjamin Earl Endicott, Jr.

Peggy started her professional career at Blue Cross/Blue Shield before going to work in the federal government part-time at the Department of the Interior. She worked for the Army Corp of Engineers, Department of Defense Health Affairs, and finished her 28 year federal career with the Administrative Office (AO) of the U.S. Courts retiring in 2007. Peggy was a fast-pitch softball pitcher in various D.C. women's leagues finishing her softball career as a slow-pitch softball pitcher for the co-ed AO Streetwalkers. Peggy liked to read and play Words with Friends, but more than that, she loved to play the slot machines. She was a faithful follower of Wayne Newton, joining his fan club in 1970 and later becoming an Area Coordinator for the Wayne Newton International Friends Club (WNIFC). She traveled extensively to see Wayne perform and was occasionally invited to his ranch in Las Vegas. But it didn't stop there, while in Vegas she attended other shows and as a result, joined the Jeff

Brandt Fan Club and the Barry Manilow International Fan Club. She enjoyed the live performances.
