I can remember more than once that she pulled the bus over and gave someone a stern talking to, leaving no doubt that she would "handle" the situation as she felt appropriate if they didn't straighten up. For what it's worth, Mrs. Shubert is one of the few adults from that part of my life that left a lasting, life-long impression on me. She was quite a woman, and I've often thought about her over the years. I'll miss her too, but I'm sure she's keeping everyone straight in Heaven!!
