Mark Joseph Pado, 56, of Purcellville, Virginia, passed away suddenly and peacefully at his home on March 8, 2025. He was born January 15, 1969 in The Hague, Netherlands to the late Joseph C. Pado and Melinda (McIntosh) Pado.

Mark lived abroad with his U.S. Foreign Service family in The Hague, Netherlands; Kathmandu, Nepal; Pointe Claire, Quebec, Canada; and Rome, Italy, before settling in Vienna, Virginia in 1978. Throughout the years, Mark spent many Saturdays breaking bread over lunch with his co-workers where bonds were forged and life lived. Mark loved and was devoted to his Mom, sister and brother. He adored his niece and nephews who in turn called him their big Teddy Bear. He treasured his friends.

Mark was predeceased by his wife, Bari Lynne (Williams) Pado, and his father, Joseph C. Pado.
