



Mark William Stremic

May 2, 1966 - January 11, 2014

On Saturday January 11, 2014, Mark Stremic of Haymarket, Virginia went home to be with the Lord. He was 47 years old. Mark Stremic was born on May 2, 1966 in Monterey California. Mark is survived by his parents, Anthony W. Stremic and Nancy U. Stremic, his sister Lynn Johnson (Payne), his brother David Stremic, his nieces Kelly and Meghan Johnson, and his brother-in-law Chris Payne.

Mark was born with a rare disorder called congenital anesthesia, which means that he could not feel any physical sensations. Doctors said that Mark would not live very long, but they were wrong.

Mark graduated from West Springfield High School in 1984. He was an avid soccer player, who idealized Pele, and fulfilled his dream by actually seeing the famous soccer player in person. After high school, Mark chose to pursue another one of his passions, music and the drums, by attending Shenandoah College and Conservatory. Mark was an outstanding musician, whose skills on a drum set impressed his teachers and peers alike. He graduated from Shenandoah in May of 1991 with a bachelor's degree in music with an emphasis in Jazz Studies. After college, Mark traveled around the DC metro area playing the drums with a variety of jazz bands in an assortment of different venues. Music was his passion and he loved sharing his gift with everyone. In addition to music, Mark loved the military (especially The Navy Seals), old cars, watching professional sports, Western and Martial Arts films, animals, tai chi, making people laugh, and his family.

Mark was a compassionate person, who loved the Lord. Mark's love of life, and his positive attitude, despite all circumstances, served as a reminder to his family, friends, and anyone who ever came in contact with him, to be thankful for the precious gift of life. His family and friends give thanks that Mark is reunited with his heavenly Father, and is whole and healthy, playing the drums for the Lord.

Mark's funeral will be held Friday, January 17, 2014 at 1:30pm at Quantico National Cemetery in Triangle, Virginia. Family and friends are invited to celebrate and remember Mark's life during a memorial service conducted by Pastor Bob Perdue.

“ It has been 5 years on since we lost Mark, and I am only now able to realize what this world really needs right now.

Mark invited himself into my life very early on in elementary school. You see, I was the introverted, awkward kid with coke bottle glasses and a patch over my left eye (the doctor's best attempt to cure my astigmatism)). I also had a bad case of what is now known as ADHD. Back then, I just agitated all my classmates and frustrated my teachers to their wit's end, usually sitting as far in the back of the room next to the coat closet, or right up front where I could be closely “monitored”. After a particularly bad day of ridicule at recess, Mark must have seen that I really needed a friend, and he just came right up to me and started a friendship that would last 40 years. There were many fond memories through our school years of Mark shredding up many a drum solo, and later on in high school playing soccer together in the same house league. Mark was always very encouraging and uplifting of others. I was very privileged to know Mark on a deeper level. Even when he shared his innermost feelings about life, how he was feeling, or the next test or procedure he had upcoming, he always had a way of turning it back around to something else, about encouraging those around him, or painting this very different and uplifting picture of the future. His was an indomitable spirit and optimism that I have never encountered since. You see, that is where Mark drew his strength, from those around him. He didn't stop for one second, living his life like there was no tomorrow, even when he wasn't feeling his best that day. After high school, we would occasionally catch up when his jazz trio was playing clubs around NOVA, or at the occasional party or reunion, or when our mutual best friend Adrian was back in town. But alas, I really let the time slip on by, and didn't see Mark again since the mid-2000s. And my final thought comes right back to my first recollection here...As we become more divided and current events seem to tear us apart, I just had a thought of how well Mark brought people together, of all different interests, and different backgrounds. Different imperfections and flaws. Regardless of whether someone carried physical scars, or emotional scars, or even some lonely and dejected kid on the playground who needed a

friend, Mark made the effort. That is what we really need, more people in this world with the heart and courage and ability to really leave your imperfections at the door, to make a positive effort to lift those around you up, despite the hardships you are going through. 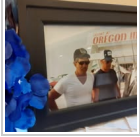
