



## Martin Joseph Callaghan

August 3, 1943 - February 3, 2025

Martin Joseph Callaghan passed away peacefully on February 3, 2025, at his home in Gainesville, VA, at the age of 81 after a courageous journey with Parkinson's Disease. Born on August 3, 1943, in New York City, he was the son of the late Martin and Delia Callaghan.

Martin is survived by his loving wife of more than 56 years, Brenda; his sons Michael (Laurie) and Brian (Molly); his grandsons, Gabriel Callaghan and Timothy Callaghan; his granddaughter, Laura Callaghan; one brother, John (Doris); two nieces, Kristin and Kate; and many extended family members and friends. Martin's role as a father and grandfather was one of his greatest sources of pride and joy.

Educated at Regis High School in NYC, Martin went on to earn his bachelor's degree from Canisius College in Buffalo, NY. He continued his academic pursuits at Georgetown Law School in Washington, DC, and practiced law for over 35 years before retiring due to Parkinson's Disease.

Martin served at Queen of Apostles Church in Alexandria as a Eucharistic Minister; a volunteer with the Sons of St Joseph; and President of the school's Parent-Teacher Organization. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus and served as a soccer coach and Little League baseball coach.

An avid reader, his large collection of books ranged from philosophy, religion, and history to mysteries and westerns. He was a fan of Turner Classic Movies and enjoyed attending plays and listening to a wide range of music. As a fan of the Buffalo Bills from his college days, he was still waiting for their first Super Bowl win.

Visitation will be Thursday, February 13, from 4-6 pm at Pierce Funeral Home, 9609 Center Street, Manassas, VA. Funeral services will be held on Friday, February 14, at 10:30 am at Holy Trinity Catholic Church, 8213 Linton Hall Rd, Gainesville, VA. Burial will follow at Bright View Cemetery, 8265 Lunsford Rd, Warrenton, VA.
