Michael Simon George, 75, of Warrenton, VA entered eternal rest on March 23, 2025. Michael was born May 29, 1949 in Washington, D.C. to Joseph George and Mildred Bratton. I got busy and am now a dad myself, and I really regret not being able to say goodbye to him, and that...I missed his ceremony yesterday.
