MICHAEL FRANCIS SCANLON, COL. USMC (Ret.), age 75, passed away on Sunday, March 16, 2014 at his home in Gainesville, VA.

Col. Scanlon was born on February 23, 1939 in Washington, D.C. to the late Michael and Catherine (Connor) Scanlon. He graduated from Gonzaga College High School in 1957 and was a 1961 graduate of Mount St. Mary's University. He served his country in the United States Marine Corps for 32 years.

Preceded in death by his parents and his sister: Eileen Scanlon Soldano. He is survived by his loving bride of 49 years, Marie; children: Colleen S. Kikis, Dr. James M. Scanlon, Michael C. Scanlon and Daniel J. I remember one day, upon his returning from leading a convoy to An Wa, we counted in excess of 100 bullet holes in his jeep, both windows shot out, the lining of his seat shot out by AK47 fire, the water can on the jeep shot off. He was cradling a Browning Automatic Rifle in his lap with numerous spent cartridges jingling on the floor of the jeep. Another trip resulted in the left front tire assembly being blown off by a mine. I appreciated the day he promoted me to corporal.
My sincerest condolences to his family and his wife. I am aware that Colonel Scanlon did two tours of duty in Viet Nam, the second as a Battalion Commander of a Motor Transport Battalion. A good officer.

I was a PFC/LCPL in 1972-1973 with "C" Company, 2nd Motor Transport Bn and LtCol Scanlon was the Battalion CO. The only real interaction I had with him was a blizzard in early 1973 that left US/UK Marines stranded in the field and we ended up working two sleepless days/nights getting them out of the field. The real impact was his recommendation/endorsement for me to attend the Naval Academy Prep School in Bainbridge, MD. I was accepted through his efforts and that of Lt.
