March 14, 1935 - February 19, 2007

PAUL DALTON PARKER, JR., age 71, of Manassas, Virginia died Monday, February 19, 2007 at his residence. He was born on March 14, 1935 in Cypress Chapel, Virginia.

Mr. Parker graduated from Chuckatuck High School in 1952 and received a BA degree in English from Elon College in North Carolina in 1956. He served in the U.S. Army from 1957-1959 and was a High School Teacher and Guidance Counselor with Prince William County Schools from 1956-1957 and from 1959-1995.

He was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and held several church positions including Bishop, Stake Patriarch and an Ordinance Worker at the Washington, D.C. Temple.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Marian (Susie) Parker; his parents, Paul and Annie Louise Parker and one sister, Betty Lou Wright.
