Percival Ashby Lewis, Jr., 94, passed away in Fairfax, Virginia on May 3, 2020. Percival was born in Washington, D.C. to Percival and Emily Lewis on June 9, 1925. Percival went on to earn an undergraduate degree from Virginia Tech University and was a veteran of World War II. Percival worked proudly as a dairy farmer and a beef farmer in later years.
