June 14, 1918 - June 5, 2010

Ralph Alphonse Rollins, age 91 of Bristow, VA died on Saturday, June 5, 2010 at Manassas Nursing and Rehab. Mr. Rollins was a life-long resident of Bristow, having lived his entire life within 1 mile of where he was born.

Mr. Rollins served in the 4th Army Infantry and fought at the Battle of the Bulge and received a purple heart and an honorable discharge after being a part of the D-Day Invasion. He worked for the U.S. Government as a supervisor of the Printing Office.

Mr. Rollins was predeceased by his parents Joseph L. and Caroline Rollins, two sisters Cecelia Rollins and Marcella Brady and by three brothers Clem Rollins, Joseph Rollins and Philip Rollins.

Survivors include his sister Caroline Martha Noel; his two brothers Paul Rollins and Albert Rollins and by multiple nieces, nephews, grand nieces and grand nephews.
