



## Richard Eichhorn

June 18, 1923 - February 20, 2008

Richard Earl Eichhorn, 84, a retired wildlife biologist with the US Fish and Wildlife Service died Wednesday, February 20, 2008 at his home in Bristow, VA. He had Leukemia.

He was a native of Davenport, Iowa and graduated from Utah State University after completing military service in World War II. He was a combat medic and was awarded the Bronze Star.

Mr. Eichhorn began his career with the Florida State Game and Fish where he did research on deer populations and migratory birds. In addition to his love of wildlife he raised and loved Arabian horses.

He was a member of Manassas Presbyterian Church for 34 years serving as an Elder and Deacon. After retirement he was an active volunteer with Habitat For Humanity.

Survivors include his wife of 60 years, Eleanor Eichhorn, a son David Eichhorn and brother Walter.
