

Richard Clayton Guy

December 20, 1928 - October 25, 2014

Richard Clayton Guy, of Manassas, VA, passed away October 25, 2014 at age 85 from complications of pneumonia.

Mr. Guy was born on December 20, 1928 in Evanston, Illinois, and grew up in Chevy Chase, Maryland. He was a third generation artist and his art ability showed from a very early age. He began studying at a Georgetown studio, especially enjoying portraiture. He was graduated from Syracuse University School of Fine Arts in 1951. Following graduation, he was an illustrator for the US Air Force and then was associated with an art studio in Manhattan. He and his family lived in Westport, Connecticut, until he established his own studio specializing in advertising art in Washington, D.C.

During this period, Mr. Guy created such works as the first drawing of the Pepperidge Farm goldfish cracker package, exhibit paintings for the U.S. Department of the Interior, a permanent portrait collection for the U.S. Patent Office, drawings for the U.S. Department of State, and many renderings for Red Cross manuals. Over the years, he painted eight views of the U.S. Capitol building which were made into Christmas cards and purchased by members of Congress.

After moving to Manassas in 1967 with his wife and four children, Mr. Guy became interested in the area's history and drew Civil War historical sites

throughout the region. He created paintings of the Manassas area for the Manassas Museum, which were used as Christmas cards, as well as Liberia Plantation, the Stone House and the Stone Bridge. He went on to create pen and ink renderings and paintings of innumerable Mid-Atlantic landmarks for the National Park Service. His paintings are hung nationally and internationally in private, corporate and government collections.

Loving his Old Town Manassas home, Mr. Guy became known for his daily walks with his dog and an ever-present cup of coffee. He loved the beach at Nags Head, the family cabin at Deep Creek Lake, and fishing of any kind

Mr. Guy was a member of Sigma Nu Fraternity, Manassas Museum Associates, and Old Town Business Association and a past member of Art Beat Gallery, Manassas Architectural Review Board and Unity of Fairfax.

Survivors include his wife of 62 years, Shirley; children Marianne Pendlebury (Stephen)

Of Herndon, Stephen (Kristy) of Costa Mesa, CA, Clayton (Angelique) of Gilbert, AZ and Allan of Manassas. His grandchildren are Michael Pendlebury, Laura Delaney (CJ), Julia Guy, Evan Guy and Chase Bailey (Leah).

The family will receive friends at Pierce Funeral Home , 9609 Center Street, Manassas, VA on Wednesday, November 12, 2014 from 6-8 PM where a memorial service will be held on Thursday, November 13, 2014 at 2:00 PM.

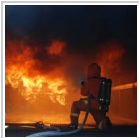
