Ronald E. Dull, 65, passed away unexpectedly on Sunday, March 23, 2025, in Woodbridge, VA. Ron, as he was affectionately known, was born February 20, 1960, to Dolan Junior Dull and Norma Jean (Turner) Dull in Fort Huachuca, AZ. He married Regina G. (Barbee) Dull on September 12, 1992, and they raised two daughters, Samantha and Sandra.

As the son of a career Army father, Ron spent his early years traveling extensively while developing a passion for adventure and the great outdoors. Ron was an avid outdoorsman spending his free time hunting, fishing, snow and water skiing, and four-wheeling. While he enjoyed the adventurous side of nature, he also enjoyed the serenity of nature as well. He loved travelling down to Lake Gaston to sit by the fire, listen to the animal noises, and fish out on the boat. While he was often successful in catching fish, it was always a good day on the water no matter if any fish were brought into the boat. He passed along his wisdom of the water to multiple generations throughout the years of bringing family and friends along to the lake.

A lifelong goal was to visit all 50 states which he was able to check off his bucket list in 2019. His travel adventures also extended abroad, with his last trip being to celebrate his 65th birthday. Ron shared his passion for skiing with his two daughters teaching them both how to ski from a young age. They created many memories while enjoying trips as a family. Although Ron spent

much of his free time outside, he also enjoyed relaxing inside.

He is survived by his wife, Regina Dull; daughters Samantha and Sandra; brothers James “Rusty”, Rob, and Brian and their respective wives; and his father Dolan. He is also survived by several uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his mother Norma.

The family will receive guests on Saturday, March 29, 2025, from 7-9pm at Pierce Funeral Home in Manassas, VA. I remember crawling under that '67 Impala to help Ronnie and Zapper change out the transmission on the cold, concrete floor of the Dull's garage. We did a lot of cruising in that land yacht, and it was amazing how Ronnie would keep up with more nimble vehicles when we would rat race the back roads (do you guys up there still have back roads?). Then there were so many endlessly long summer days searching for relief from boredom, often starting around the pool table in the Dull's basement, ending anywhere we could get into a bit of trouble unobserved. Sometimes that was the tressel in Clifton (target practice anyone?). My first job was working as a dishwasher at the same Howard Johnson's Ben mentioned below. I had to get that job after attending a regular morning "70's Show" circle in the Dull's basement. Sturge and I got into my mom's 68' Rambler wagon to leave and promptly backed from the Dull's driveway into Zap's Mustang parked across the street, crushing his door. I probably would not have worked willingly at the point in life if I had not had to pay Zap back. I was sometimes a little foggy after those sessions, I guess. If he was not working, Ron was always in the middle of whatever we were up to. Even then he worked a lot of hours. I want to shout out to the Wylie Boofer, who was always particularly close to Ronnie, to say I know he's missing Ron, and also to say that I eventually figured what you two meant when you would both, at moments, feign the various symptoms of a heavy hangover, repeatedly groaning the phrase, "Bemis(h)!"*

Hey Ronnie, more than anything else, when Zap told me this week that you had died, I regretted not having seen you in such a long time. We all get busy, and this f'in' modern life seems to drag most of us from home to one place, then another, then likely another, always seeking opportunity, but maybe losing a whole lot more along the way, like good friends. Good friends like you. Hail to you, Ziggy! There were so many good times. I wish I could remember them all [again, a little foggy, those sessions were not limited to

morning or any other time of day(or night)].
