



Roy Cioletti

July 19, 1944 - June 5, 2004

DR. ROY R. CIOLETTI, age 59, of Manassas, Virginia died Saturday, June 5, 2004 at INOVA Fairfax Hospital, Falls Church, Virginia.

Born in Paterson, NJ, Dr. Cioletti attended Brown University, graduating in 1966. He attended New Jersey College of Medicine where he graduated in 1970. Dr. Cioletti completed his internship and residency at Children's Hospital in Washington, DC. He served as president of the Prince William Hospital medical staff from 1990 through 1992 and served on several of the hospital committees from 1979 through 1992. Dr. Cioletti was a pediatrician at Prince William Hospital since 1979. He loved serving the children of the community.

Survivors include his wife of seven years, Debbie Cioletti, two sons Paul Cioletti, of Woodbridge, VA and Matthew Cioletti and his wife, Angela of Gainesville, VA.
