



## Stephen Brady Maas

October 26, 1963 - February 27, 2025

Stephen Brady Maas died Thursday, February 27, 2025 from complications following an infection.

A lifelong comedian and performer, Stephen would do anything for a laugh or a smile.

Born October 26, 1963 near Camp Pendleton in Southern California, Stephen was the second youngest child of Col. Bertram Arthur Maas (b. 1931, d. 2011) and Charlotte Hiser (b. 1933, d. 2021). Bert and Charlotte had six sons, including Stephen: John, Michael, Brian “Curtiss,” Charles, and Brad.

Stephen and his brothers grew up on military bases around the country during their father Bert’s career as an officer in the U.S. Marine Corps, with time spent living in Hawaii, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, California and Vienna, Virginia (where Stephen attended Oakton High School). The family settled in Vienna upon Bert’s retirement.

Stephen attended James Madison University in 1981 and then transferred to George Mason University in 1983. He graduated from Mason in 1986 with a bachelor’s degree in economics.

Following jobs at People Express Airlines and Phase Linear, Stephen joined

insurance company State Farm in 1988 and eventually rose through the ranks from a claims adjuster to a State Farm agent himself by 2000. He retired from State Farm in the fall of 2023.

Twice married, Stephen is survived by his three children Jennifer (b. 1990), Bryan (b. 1993), and Nicholas (b. 2000). He bought a house to raise his family in in South Riding, Virginia, never too far from his parents Charlotte and Bert in Vienna, who he enjoyed regularly visiting while operating his insurance agency out of Oakton.

Two of the most important aspects of Stephen's life were his sobriety journey and his struggle with chronic pain. Stephen managed both through his work as a passionate member of Alcoholics Anonymous and his time attending and volunteering at New Life Christian Church
