“ Five years ago, Steve walked into my home in Haymarket with Sarah and his friends Casey and Allison. They all came because they wanted to know more about who Jesus is, how they could be good parents, spouses and friends through relationship with a church.

I knew Steve would be someone special to me when one of the first things he said was "I'm an atheist". Hmmm, I thought. This is going to be good. Through the next several weeks of meeting together to work through a study guide introducing Christianity with Steve and the rest, I could always be sure he would come in with some humdinger of a question: "If God loves us so much, how come he let the <Insert name of bad thing here> happen?" or "What about evolution then? What about dinosaurs and fossils? The Bible is so inconsistent with science." I felt so grateful God sent Steve to us - Those questions were the same ones I struggled with for the longest time - and still do sometimes so I think he was a little surprised that we were so happy to talk about them openly and discuss how we struggled with them too.

But more importantly, he learned that a relationship with Jesus, and experiencing His love surpasses all the questions. That science doesn't have to conflict with faith, that one can be both a believer in Christ and a skeptic. That being a Christian doesn't mean turning your brain off.

Over the weeks, Steve quietly came to the same conclusion and became a strong man of faith. He struggled from time to time - we all do, but he always sought out his friends and his savior to help him through. Even if we had to seek him out and remind him that we (and Jesus) were still here.

I am so grateful for knowing Steve and all his family. I am heartbroken to have to say goodbye to him now, long before we ever thought we would have to. But I am so thankful that our Lord led him (dragged him maybe) into my home so that he could hear of

the love that Jesus has for him, and the life change that his relationship with Jesus brought to him, his family and to those that knew him.

I am sure that Steve woke up last week in heaven, maybe a bit surprised but I suspect that he is asking some of those questions again. I know I'll be asking when I join him, and I know that both of us will be amazed at the new perspective we have when we stand beside our Jesus and hear his words.
