It brought her great joy to know she was bringing a smile to someone's face with the items she made. Her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren will have fond memories they can remember and hold onto when they curl up under the blankets she crocheted for them.

Teresa adored all animals and she was as drawn to them as they were to her. She was a collector of all things related to angels and had her collection displayed as a sign and reminder of her strong Catholic faith. Teresa enjoyed playing Bingo with friends and family, and with luck on her side, it seemed she won nearly as often as she played! She was also an avid reader and enjoyed an eclectic genre of books, movies and TV shows, including Sci-Fi, Horror, Hallmark Movies and HGTV. Teresa made no secret of her goal to live to age 100, but she was called home by Our Lord a little sooner than that, and just shy of her next birthday.

Teresa's family will celebrate her life when they gather for her ceremony on what would have been her 95th birthday. She will be dearly missed by her family, and she will always be celebrated and remembered for the wonderful

woman she was!

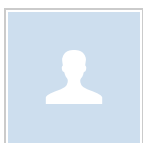
