



Theodore Pratt III

November 30, 1949 - January 28, 2026

Theodore Pratt III (aka Ted, Teddy, Bee man, to his friends and family) passed away from natural causes on January 28, 2026, in his home in Manassas, VA.

Ted was survived by his brother, Stephen Pratt; his sisters, Katherine Pratt and Laurian Fasano; a nephew and three nieces whom he loved and adored.

Ted was a Vietnam vet (Air Force) and a retired beekeeper. A bear took out the last of his hives several years ago, giving him that final push toward retirement, so none of his bees survived him.

Above all, Ted always wanted everyone to know this:

"I found our Lord in the Catholic Church and it changed my life, at the age of 65."

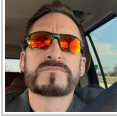
What a precious soul ! Ted so loved sharing good news and his favorite was his deep faith. I am praying comfort for all who knew and cared for Ted.
