Theodore Thomas Sevigny Jr, 78, of Gainesville, VA, passed away on June 24, 2025, at home after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Born in 1946 to parents Theodore and Edith, along with brother Robert, he grew up in Pontiac, Michigan. He served in the Navy as a CDR (Mustang) on the USS Boston and in the Navy Reserve. He worked as a Naval Analyst for the Office of Naval Intelligence and Defense Intelligence Agency, a Senior Duty Officer at the White House Situation Room, and as a Senior Intelligence Officer at DIA.
