Thomas Allen Nedrow, 83, of Haymarket, Virginia, passed away on November 10, 2024.

Tom was born March 20, 1941, in Baltimore, Maryland, son of Ira E. and Mildred (Stoner) Nedrow. He grew up in Kingsville, Maryland, and graduated from Pennsylvania State University, earning a B.S. in Industrial Education. He was a member of Alpha Kappa Lambda fraternity.

Tom spent his career as an industrial arts teacher at Verona High School, Verona, New Jersey, for 36 years, teaching wood shop, metal shop, mechanical drawing, photography, graphic arts, and more.

He enjoyed walking his dogs in the neighborhood, reading, and doing crossword puzzles. Just before his death, Tom accompanied his daughter, Stacey, on a Nile River Cruise in Egypt.

Remaining to cherish Tom's memory are his wife of almost 55 years, Paulette (Shifman), daughter Stacey Nedrow-Wigmore, nephews William Shifman (Stacey) and Michael Shifman (Mariah), and niece Sydney Shifman, along with several grand nieces and nephews. He also leaves behind his beloved dachshunds, Pixie and Tinkerbelle.
