“ My sister, Toni and I, have the best of a friendship in addition to being siblings. I have many great memories of our time here on earth together that I will cherish until my final day.

Toni, 8 years my senior, through stories that have been told and by her actions, was almost like a parent to me in my early years and often throughout my younger life. She was often there in support of me as a child and as I became an adult with a family of my own.

I got married the first time when I and my wife were way too young, but when nature took it's course, Toni and Clet were the ones to stand up for us at the courthouse as witnesses and as best man and maid of honor. They were the only people to attend our wedding. When that marriage ended in divorce some 6 years later and a custody battle ensued that lasted for many years after the divorce, they were there, again. Supporting me in court by being present and testifying. On one occasion when I needed money and unable to get a loan at a low interest rate, Toni was there again lending my family money at a very low interest rate. She often bought very nice clothes and especially dresses for my daughters, Christine and Kim, from my first marriage when it was just the girls and me. She continued to do that for all of our girls on occasion after I was married again. She also provided hand me downs from her daughter, Kellie, for my girls. After I was stationed in the DC area in the mid 80s, she was there for my family picking up our younger twin girls from our neighbor and keeping them overnight when our oldest daughter had emergency surgery. She was at all of her nieces' graduations from high school and college and their weddings. These type of memories go on and on.

In the later years, after our children were grown, and we were separated by many miles, we found time to visit each other several times a year. We talked on the phone fairly often discussing our families, politics, the state of the world, etc. We got together often to visit in person or take a trip together to see Aunt Frances (our mother's youngest sibling still living at age 95), or go on a trip

together with our brother, Dale, to research family ancestry. In the last several years, Susan and I took Toni and Jane, (Toni's best friend and the closest to being a sister to Toni that she could be), on a fall trip to New England. A year and half later, Toni flew out to St Louis and Susan and I took her on a spring trip through Oklahoma City, Dallas, and San Antonio.

Toni was my sister and my friend! I will miss her immensely!!!

“ For 61 yers Toni and I were best friends and then “adopted” sisters. We met during our senior year in high school when we were both working downtown after school.

After getting to know Toni this couple decided to introduce her to a friend of theirs, Clet, a pilot. We started double dating and after two years Ray and I got married. Six months later Toni and Clet got married. The Navy then sent us to different shores across the country. They went to Florida and we were sent to California. After two years Ray was sent to Vietnam. He came home and the next month Clet was sent to Vietnam. During this Toni and I brought these great guys back to Virginia.

We both had two children. Before the children were grown and way too young these two wonderful men passed away- first Clet and then Ray.

When the children got older, Toni and I started meeting in Williamsburg or Richmond to visit, shop and sight see. We also traveled together. We were recently trying to figure where we could go. She just took the final trip alone.
