



Vernon Hill Mays

December 26, 1936 - October 27, 2021

Vernon Hill Mays, age 84, of Manassas Virginia passed away on October 27, 2021.

He was born and raised in Lynchburg Virginia. He enlisted with the United States Army in 1955 and worked with the Hercules Nike Missile Project in Lorton VA until it was decommissioned in 1973. He served in the Virginia National Guard as a reserve until his retirement in 1986. He worked full time with the US Department of Commerce in Washington DC until retirement in 1996. Over the years he was an active member of the Manassas Jaycees, Manassas Host Lions Club and the Manassas Men's Club. His hobbies included golf, reading and volunteering with military vets.

He was the son of Sidney Hill Mays and Nette Massie Campbell and the oldest of 3 children. He is survived by his first wife Frances E Mehalick, his daughter Kimberly Mays Ford, and 2 grandsons Kyle K Ford and Kristopher R Ford.

He is preceded in death by brother Fred Mays, his son Vernon Hill Mays J and his second wife Mildred C Wilcoxon.

A military burial will be at Quantico National Cemetery on Thursday, Nov 4, 2011 at 230pm followed by a Celebration of Life at 4pm at the American
