Walter William Johnson, passed peacefully on Father's Day, Sunday, June 16th, 2024, at 85 years of age. Born on July 24, 1938, to Eveline Doone and Richard Johnson, of Lawrence, Massachusetts. Walter was a long time resident of Manassas/Haymarket and a pillar of the community he so dearly loved.

Walter was a graduate of Merrimack College and went on to serve his country in the Army. He continued his government service with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for 34 years. During which time he received his master's in public administration at the University of Southern California. In retirement, he enjoyed working for Home Depot, he loved helping people as a tax preparer and worked as a claims estimator which he thoroughly enjoyed, in addition to being a doting grandfather.
