On Monday, April 30, 2018, John 'Wes' Walker, the beloved husband of Diane, loving father of Wes, Kimberley, and Alexander, granddad to Madison and Taylor, father-in-law to Robert and Nina, passed away comforted and strengthened by his faith and surrounded by family and dear friends after a difficult battle with cancer. He was born February 18, 1945 in Philadelphia, PA. He worked his entire career at Mobil Oil Corporation as a Chemical Engineer at offices in Paulsboro, NJ, New York City, and Fairfax, VA.
