Bill Armistead, age 88, (beloved husband of Frances) of Bristow, VA, and previously, Berwyn Heights, MD, died on Sunday, January 12, 2020. He is a native of Washington, DC, served with the Air Force in Okinawa, Japan during the Korean War, and was a longtime employee of The Kiplinger Washington Editors. He loved to serve his fellow man whether at work, home, church, or in the community. He served on the town council and as Mayor of Berwyn Heights (1975-1995), and prior to this coached in little league, led the Cub Scouts, and was president of the PTA for Berwyn Heights Elementary School. He was an active member of the First United Methodist Church of Hyattsville, MD. He was a faithful Redskins season ticket holder for over 50 years and fan of all local sports teams. He enjoyed playing softball and basketball in the Berwyn Heights Men's League. After retirement, Bill and Frances relocated to Bristow, Virginia, where he became active in the Gainesville United Methodist Church, VA and within the Dunbarton community.

Bill was a dear husband to Frances for 62 years, loving father of Carol (Bob Lavoie), Paul (Barbara), Linda, and Donald (Carlene), and grandfather to Robert, David, Jennifer, and Melissa. He is survived by his sister Carolyn (Timmins) and is an uncle to many. He is predeceased by sisters Mary Ann (Harper) and Annalee (Brookes).
