“ My Mom, being the youngest of eight, wanted to give my sister, Diane and I all the things that she missed as a child. She decided to help my Dad do this by taking a job as a custodian at a local elementary school. She worked hard and had many late nights. As a kid, I didn't think about the sacrifices she made. My sister and I were able to participate in many activities including, baseball, majorettes, etc. Looking back, standing on the baseball field with a new glove, bat and shoes and my sister Diane, with a new majorette outfit and a baton was made possible by mom's hard work. Mom gave Diane and I the opportunities to follow our passions. She was a devoted grandmother to her grand kids, Joe, Jon, Amanda and Josh. After my Dad passed in 1991, I felt Mom would have a hard time. She proved to be stronger than I thought. About three months after Dad passed, she made a decision to move to S.W. Virginia to be closer to her brothers and sisters. She bought a trailer next door to her sister, Bell. They had such a great time together. We all knew if something happened to Bell, Mom wouldn't want to stay in Clintwood alone.

An early snow storm hit Clintwood causing power and phone service to be out for two weeks. During this time her sister, Bell passed away. Her only living brother, Homer D. was able to check on her several days after the storm. Her cousin, Darrell kept her trailer warm with a kerosene heater. After the weather broke, Donna and I decided to go get her. We pulled up to her trailer and the electric company was still working to restore power. She was so happy to see us! We took her back with us to Manassas.

While she was visiting, I asked her if she wanted to live with us. She said, yes. We moved her to Manassas. A couple of years later, she slipped and fell in the garage. She broke her hip. Donna and I had to make a decision. Donna, without skipping a beat, agreed to quit work and take care of Mom. Mom was diagnosed with dementia shortly after this. At the same time, Donna's Mom was on dialysis and her Dad had suffered two heart attacks.

I want to thank my wife, Donna for her loving and caring heart. She is a great caregiver. I thank God everyday for her.

Each month I watched my strong Mother become more dependent

on us. A couple months before Mom's 78th birthday, Donna suggested we have her a surprise party. Of course, I said, "Why"? It's only her 78th. Donna in her wisdom, knew better. Her nieces Brenda, Linda and Jimmy came up from S.W. Virginia to surprise her for her party. The smile on her face was priceless and she just cried when she saw them.

Less than a month ago her nieces came to see her again. They travel throughout Virginia singing gospel music and Mom loved to hear them sing This last visit, they pulled out their guitar and gave Mom her own personal concert in the living room and she loved it! She loved them so much.

Wednesday, we called our sons to say goodbye to their Mamaw. They came. Joseph shared a memory about Mamaw driving him when he was fifteen. She made a turn into oncoming traffic. Joe told her to make a U-turn quick! (which she did). Jonathan also shared a memory about going to Mamaw's as a young boy. Mamaw had a blue mason jar full of gummy bears. He always looked forward to getting a little treat.

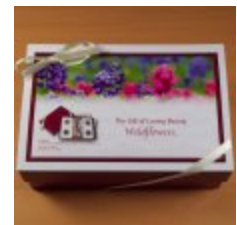
