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Wyatt Ivers, a loving son, caring brother and devoted partner and friend, passed away on September 15th, 2024 at the age of 24. He was born on March 26th, 2000 to Yvonne Cale Ivers and Joseph Tyrus Ivers III. Wyatt grew up in Nokesville, Virginia at Foggy Bottom Farm with his sister, Emily Ivers. As a young boy growing up on a sprawling farm, Wyatt enjoyed hunting, fishing, and otherwise communing with nature.

Wyatt attended Brentsville District High School in the Class of 2018. He went on to graduate from James Madison University with a degree in Biology. Following school, Wyatt moved to Islamorada, Fl., where he met the love of his life, Haley Doege. Wyatt adored life in the Keys, spending his days fishing, scuba diving, and boating under the Florida sun. True to his love of nature and wildlife, Wyatt worked as a Biological Scientist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission as well as on a lobstering boat.

Wyatt is survived by his parents, sister and girlfriend; grandparents Barbara Cale, Clorinda Driscoll, Joseph Ivers and Connie Cummings; many aunts, uncles and cousins, and countless friends; as well as his pet rabbit, Buck. Beloved by everyone in his community, Wyatt is remembered as a smart,

caring and immensely sweet person.
