Zane S. Mason, builder of homes and hearts, passed from this life surrounded by loved ones Sunday afternoon Feb.27, 2011.

Born July 9, 1927 in Roanoke VA he was eldest child of Earl Thomas Mason and Nora Ethel Turner Mason. He was raised in Arlington from the age of 2. As a boy he roamed and rambled the woods and roads from Clarendon down to the Potomac River. The passing of his mother when he was 9 years of age provided him experience of hard work and caring for and about his sister Dorothy Miller and brother Earl Thomas Jr. (descd'06) His father, a carpenter/home builder, gave them a wonderful upbringing despite difficult circumstances-taking them many places: Monticello, Mt Vernon, Sunday picnics to Hains Pt. and Great Falls; drives along the Skyline. His summers were spent well loved and cared for rotating between family farms in Roanoke. He graduated (Class of '45) mid year- a frequent practice during wartime-- from Washington-Lee HS, to enlist in military service (Maritime Service and US Army'45-'47).

He was married 61 yrs to and is survived by the love of his life Laura Louise Roberts. Together they devotedly raised Linda Jeffs, Jane Zeyer, Nancy Hall, Laura Smallwood and John Mason.

Zane loved his career of drafting, building and developing, working many years in partnership with his brother. He took pride in work well done. Son
